




# **Christian Outreach**

**Water filters:** Water filters are an effective solution for providing access to clean drinking water and reducing water-borne diseases in marginalized communities. CMA is committed to successful implementation that requires proper education on filter use/maintenance and cultural acceptance. Over 2,000 water filter kits were distributed to families in Maasailand and the urban slums.

# **Uganda Orisai Irrigation Project:** Providing food for an entire community

The flourishing 22-acre irrigation project continues to provide nourishment for the community, including the 350 students at Grace Junior School. By utilizing the lake water, this resourceful project ensures year-round cultivation of corn, onions, amaranth, and sweet potatoes.

Not only does the harvest provide ample food for the community, but the surplus is sold to generate income. This income, in turn, is reinvested in farm inputs, guaranteeing the project's long-term success. This innovative approach to irrigation is a model for other communities seeking to achieve food security and economic empowerment.


## Aid & relief
